

I don't have much to report on in this news letter as the breeding season is just getting started. I did get a visit from Mike our club sec. Mike picked up a few birds from me and then we went up the mountain and spent some time with Jeff, where Mike got a few more birds. Jeff treated us to pizza after an extended visit to his loft. I had not been up to Jeff's loft in some time and was very impressed with his birds. I enjoyed the visit with both Mike and Jeff.

I am breeding from six pair of blacks, four pair of whites, three pair of reds, six pair of yellows, four Andalusian and one red tiger. I am excited about these pairs as they look like the best I have ever put together. So far I have had many eggs left cold in the nest and a few squabs, also many blank eggs. This always happens to me because I breed mostly from young birds. The weather going from rain to sun and back to rain over and over again always causes problems with the birds walking away from their nests. So far I have two reds, a black, and four Andalusian banded for 2017 as of Feb. Ist.

After watching Bob and Layne work with the white bars it made me want to work with a lesser bred color. I always had project pairs going when I had all the colors, and it was productive and fun. Last season



I started with Andalusian. I raised several birds with two cock birds with very nice color, kind of a darker blue with laced wings. The first two squabs out this season are of good color and great body and wings. If they blow a round globes, and it is in their background, they could be very nice. I'm hoping for the best.

Hope every one is started and doing well.

Vice-President's Report by Fred Maenpa

Hello again to all AFBCC Members and friends. After a very exciting and enjoyable show season most breeders around the country are now concentrating on the beginning of the 2017 breeding season. It was a pleasure to see and spend time with many of our AFBCC members at the three major shows that I attended last year. The Great Western, the Pageant of Pigeons, and the Washington National were all outstanding Brunner shows. At the National our Brunners were the second largest Pouter breed total with 49 birds shown. The Norwich Croppers were number one with an outstanding showing of 96 beautiful birds.

I would like to thank the members that attended the National and in particular, Mike Hughes, for serving as our Brunner judge. Mike did a great job sorting through our birds. The Champion was a White OC and the Reserve Champion a Black Tiger OH. I am happy to report that both birds were from my loft. Refer to the National Show Report found in this bulletin for a complete report.

Now, onto a sad part of my report. After returning home from the National, pairing up my birds for 2017, and moving many of my extra birds, I have experienced major losses in all breeds. As of this morning my losses totaled just under 90 birds. These losses did not start until the last week of February and the first week of March. I have tried everything you had seen written "without success." What is "currently" working for babies, still the nest, is "Nutri-Drops." I do not count 2017 babies as part of my losses, since they normally do not stand a chance. But, since using the "Nutri-

Drops" daily into the beaks of all babies I have been able to save all of them. Before using the drops the babies would die within a week or so. I will keep



everyone posted as to the final results as time moves ahead.

I wish everyone a successful 2017 breeding season and hope you will never have to experience the major losses like I am going through this year. Let's all do our best to raise a few extra birds in 2017. Our Brunners drew a lot of attention at all of the shows last year, and to my knowledge, all the available Brunners were sold at each of the shows that I attended in 2016. Let's continue to keep our Brunners, at or near, the top of the total Pouter entries around the country.






