I think my progress this year will have to be measured in a negative. I did raise a couple of very promising blue white bars but unfortunately they fell victim to the Young Bird Disease. Oh well, there's always next year.

Speaking of YBD, I'm hearing that certain parts of Europe is having some issues with this again. I guess this is just how things will be in the future. We all need to key in on selecting the most healthy birds for further breeding and reducing the stress on our birds as much as possible. In the past I have used oregano, elderberry, and probiotic capsules to help maintain the health of my birds. I'm stocked up and prepared to support the immune system of birds being exhibited. It seems if I can them past 6 months of age there are few problems. Most of the health issues have been with birds between 1 and 3 months old.

We had a nice show in Salt Lake City. Numbers of Brunners were a bit lower but there were some very nice birds exhibited. Richard Bohman won champion and reserve with blacks. He also showed a wonderful black white flight. This is a tough call since this is essentially a mismarked Black—something not allowed in the standard. This is a good example of a genuine stock bird.

The Pageant of Pigeons was cancelled this year due to outbreaks of Newcastle disease in chickens and I really miss this show. There won't be a Pageant next year either since the NPA Grand National is scheduled for Fresno.

But I am excited about the National in Amarillo. For those who attended last time you know that is was a wonderful show and loads of fun. We're expecting a great turnout of Pouters and encourage everyone to participate.

Hats off to everyone who is doing such a fine job promoting Brunners. Keep it up!

Finally, we'll close out the show season with the Hurricane Show in Southern Utah. This occurs the next weekend after the National in Amarillo so it will make things a bit busy but it's a show I always love to attend. A nice, relaxed atmosphere is perfect for the end of the show season.

I look forward to seeing many of you in Amarillo and Hurricane. Bob and I will represent the Brunner group in Europe. We'll both be in Leipzig where there are 844 Brunners entered. And I'll stay for the show in Wijchen, Netherlands on the following weekend.

I haven't had any time for photos. Been real busy lately raccoon proofing everything again. Those critters adapt very fast when

you block their access to the birds. I've lost five birds to them in the past two weeks. Four birds lost one leg, and one(my oldest yg bird, and terrific yellow hen) was eaten completely through 1X1 welded wire. I'm not ever using larger than 1x1/2 welded wire again.

I've been reworking all of my pens, putting cement board floors and outside water boxes with heated water bucket drinkers on the outside. I'm still mulling how I can feed each pen from the outside. When that is done, I will be gutting my loft out and putting 32 individual pens in it, and adding young bird pens on the outside north and south. No more scooping up the floor. It will be much easier on my old body. All pens will be at least waist high.

Considering that I didn't mate most of my birds till May, I had a good year. Had to breed till September however. I made real progress with all of my genetic projects. Nice jump with the Almonds after five years. Plan to show a couple at Amarillo. Raised two gorgeous recessive yellow opals. Did get a few bronzes and bronze barred blues. The bronze bar blues are from my bronzes as they are split for bar. (these two colors are identical to bronze and blue schietti in modenas) Introduced indigo and andalusian into my blacks, and blues, and got some nice indigo bars, andalusian, and a couple nice T pattern indigo. Also a dilute andalusian. Best year with black tigers in a few years. As usual, several blacks, but only a few recessive reds, yellows, & whites. I had good numbers in blue and silvers, bar and check. White bars were a disappointment after a good year last year.

I'll be judging the meets at Hutchinson KS Nov 16, and DesMoines in Dec. I plan to have a good entry of Brunners, Horseman, Genuine Homer's, and Exhibition Homer's at the Amarillo National. I'm hoping that everything goes well and that all of my plans work out. I have my room reserved. My friend Pat Sabin is going to drive down with me. My brother and I have house in Hobert OK, just about 200 miles from Amarillo. Plan to drive there on Wednesday and on to Amarillo on Thursday. Then reverse that Saturday afternoon. Looking forward to seeing everyone there! *Carlin*

But, once again, I must sit back and wait with my fingers crossed, since Charlie lives in Riverside and his home is within the quarantined area. Let's see how things work out over the next few weeks. One way or another I will be at the Amarillo National with our AFBCC Awards in tow. (see picture on the next page) In addition, I will also have a limited number of printed copies of our current and past AFBCC Bulletins available, upon request. I look forward to once again seeing many of our AFBCC members in attendance at the National. For those of you that were not at the last



Amarillo National you can look forward to a roomy show hall, a wonderful banquet, and a beautiful hotel (The Embassy Suites) located directly across the street from the show hall. Once again, I hope to see many of my Brunner buddies and other Pouter fanciers, at the NPA's 100 Year Anniversary Show, January 23-25, 2020.

Before closing, I must comment on the recent Purebred Pigeon "Pouter Special". I am very happy to report that I have heard nothing but positive comments from both Pouter and Non-Pouter fanciers. I guess the best place to start is with the breeding season that just ended. All in all I would have to call it a bad one. It started out well with seventy birds banded by Easter, then young birds disease started. It took until August just to remain with seventy birds banded. Maybe a few more but they would die as fast as I raised them. At that point I cleaned all my lofts, hand scraping them, sweeping the floors ,and then sprayed them with a fifty-fifty mix of bleach and water. I did this because some new birds were coming to



the loft and I was trying not to get any youngsters sick. To my surprise it worked, not only for the new birds but my birds as well. I only lost one young bird after that and it did not die of the young birds disease. The young birds disease would take along time to kill the bird. It seems like they starved, just skin and bones when they died. The bird I lost after the spraying was very sudden and was in good flesh.

The new birds were from Fred. We have a project going on. After the spray I have raised thirty or forty more birds. The birds I did raise had a few very nice ones among them. The project that Fred and I have going is mostly pied birds. We are trying to get enough to have breeding programs started for each of us and to share with other breeders. So, it's going pretty well. With five and most likely more pairs we should be in good shape.

With all that was going on in California this year the shows were limited. I did attend the Fresno show. We had three breeders showing, but one of the most competitive shows I have been in. We had sixty one brunners in fourteen colors. I was lucky to win with a blue t pattern young hen. Meg, our junior member had some whites, that had they performed better in the show cage, would have gave me a real run. Jeff and I displayed 7 blue checks together that were all very good. Again, the performance of the birds was the difference. Hope everybody is as charged up as much as I am for next years breeding.
